## Practical Battle Rifle Match (Rifle)

Date: Sunday June 8, 2025

**Setup:** 0800

Match Starts: 0930

# This will be a rifle only match.

Stage Diagrams are located on pages 2-4.

**Stage 1:** 50 yards (standing)

**Stage 2:** 75 yards (sitting or kneeling)

Stage 3: 100 yards (prone)

#### Ammo count if shot clean:

Fifty yards- 12 rounds if shot clean. Bring extra ammo and magazines. Seventy-Five yards- 14 rounds if shot clean. Bring extra ammo and magazines. One Hundred yards- 12 rounds if shot clean. Bring extra ammo and magazines.

#### **Remember:**

Only eight (8) rounds allowed in the rifle magazines Cost is \$10.00 for the match.

### Course of fire: All stages will be timed.

**Stage 1.** (Standing) Shooter starts at the table with an empty rifle, hands on the table. At the buzzer, load a magazine and engage targets C1thru C4 and T1 thru T4 (2 shots on each paper target. Engage clay targets at shooters discretion. You choose how many attempts. Remember you are being timed. When finished, u se the command "If finished, show clear, if clear, flag firearm. (Same commands as Steel Challenge and USPSA). Targets will be scored and added to the time of the stage. Each missed steel plate will add 5 seconds to your time, and the paper targets will be scored 0,1,3,5.

**Stage 2.** (Sitting or Kneeling) Shooter starts sitting or kneeling with empty rifle. At the buzzer, load rifle and engage T1 thru T7 with two shots each. When finished, use the command "If finished, show clear, if clear, flag firearm. (Same commands as Steel Challenge and USPSA). Targets will be scored and added to the time of the stage. Targets will be scored 0,1,3,5.

**Stage 3**. (Prone) Shooter starts prone with empty rifle. At the buzzer, load rifle and engage the steel targets S1 thru S12 at your discretion. When finished, use the command "If finished, show clear, if clear, flag firearm. (Same commands as Steel Challenge and USPSA). Each missed steel plate will add 5 seconds to your time.


This match is open to all classes (1,3,4,5,6 open sights and scoped). I don't recommend bolts, (too slow) All rifles must have an action indicator installed in the receiver going to and from the firing lines.


